The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the Notice of Race means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.
- 1.2 The Yachting Australia Special Regulations Part 2 for Off the Beach Boats.

2 **ADVERTISING**

In accordance with the International Flying Fifteen Class Rules and ISAF Regulation 20.5.1, no advertising shall be displayed pursuant to ISAF Regulation 20.3.2 (advertising chosen by the person in charge on sails, spars and hulls).

3 **ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all Flying Fifteen International boats holding a valid measurement certificate.
- 3.2 The helm and crew shall be financial members of an Association affiliated with FFI.
- 3.3 All entrants are eligible to compete in the Open Division.
- 3.4 Entry shall be made by completing the <u>online entry form</u>. Entries must be received by **1700 hours on** Monday 20 January 2020.
- 3.5 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

4 **FEES**

4.1 Entry for this regatta is \$50.00

5 **SCHEDULE**

- 5.1 A maximum of six (6) races will be conducted for the series.
- 5.2 The times of racing are as follows:

- 5.3 To alert competitors that another race is to be sailed in a session, code flag Q will be displayed as boats are finishing the previous race. This flag will be removed with multiple sound signals one minute before the attention signal is displayed for the ensuing race
- 5.4 No warning signal will be made after 1600 hours on Sunday, 2 February 2020.

6 **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

Sailing Instructions will be available on the Royal Freshwater Bay Yacht Club website at, www.rfbyc.asn.au on or before Wednesday, 29 January 2020.

7 **VENUE**

- 7.1 The venue for this Regatta will be Fremantle Sailing Club.
- 7.2 Access: Competitors are required to report to the FSC Harbour Office upon arrival where they must register, provide proof of insurance and pay a \$50 deposit (refundable) to receive an access FOB key (limited to one per boat).
- 7.3 The racing area will be Owen Anchorage.

8 THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be as described in detail in the Sailing Instructions.

9 **PENALTY SYSTEM**

- 9.1 The penalty for breaking a rule of Part 2 shall be a One Turn Penalty (one tack and one gybe in the same direction) except that for infringements within the Zone, as defined in the RRS, shall be a Two Turns Penalty (two tacks and two gybes in the same direction). This changes RRS 44.1 and 44.2
- 9.2 A boat that has taken a penalty under rule 44.1 or retired shall complete an acknowledgement form at the Regatta Office within the Protest Time Limit.

10 SCORING

- 10.1 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 10.2 (a) When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When five or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

11 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Radio communications shall be in accordance with the Flying 15 Class Rules 14.5

12 **RESULTS**

13.1 Results will be announced at the post regatta function on Sunday, 2 February 2020.

14 **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The Organising Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

15 **INSURANCE**

Each participating boat shall have third-party liability and public liability insurance cover of not less than \$10,000,000. By signing the Entry Form entrants declare that they hold such insurance in respect of this boat and this regatta and that they will continue to do so for the duration of the regatta.
